It is a busy time of year with a lot going on at SHHS and the same goes for the Redskins Counseling Corner. Please mark your calendars for the upcoming events that will take place for various grade levels.

On **December 7**th the sophomore students have the opportunity to visit Tri Star Career Compact. Students attending will observe two career tech pathways of their choice. Tri Star will host an Open House on **Monday, December 11**th **from 5:30-7:30 pm** for interested students and their parents. Students interested in attending must have their applications turned into the guidance office by the designated deadline on the form.

In January, I will be meeting with grades 9-11 to share the course request information for the next year. The Course Description Book can be found under the Guidance tab of the school website at *Redskin Counseling Corner* to refer to course offerings in the high school.

On Monday, February 5th at 6:30 pm in the Commons, there will be a mandatory College Credit Plus meeting for any student(s) interested in taking college courses and at least one parent/guardian must attend as well. This meeting must be attended whether the student is taking courses at St. Henry or off-site. Students must have the letter of intent form signed and turned into the guidance office by April 1st in order to be eligible to take courses for the next academic year. *Please note:* if this form is not on file, students will be ineligible to take any College Credit Plus classes. All College Credit Plus Information can be found at *Redskin Counseling Corner* under *School – College Credit Plus*.

On **Wednesday, February 7**th at 6:30 pm in the Commons, there will be an 8th Grade Orientation Meeting for all current 8th grade students and at least one parent/guardian. If you are unable to attend, please contact Mrs. Overman.

All juniors will take the <u>ACT on March 12th, 2024</u>. Students will create ACT accounts at school approximately 2 weeks prior to the test in order for their scores to be sent for free to four institutions of their choice. It is highly encouraged that they utilize the four free places, so students DO NOT have to pay at a later time to have their scores sent.

In October and November, I shared with the high school families the newsletter created by the Mercer County ESC family liaison, Beth Guggenbiller. These newsletters provided valuable information on ways to support family connections and assist your child in their education as well as share community resources around the county. Bus drivers do everything in their power to keep the kids safe on and around the school bus, no matter the conditions. As motorists, please help the bus drivers! 
