## News from the Bus Stop

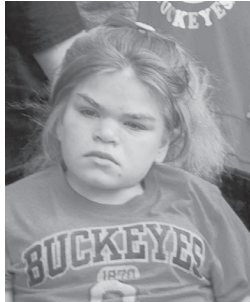

MPS day is May 15 - Please wear Purple!

MPS IIIA is called Sanfilippo Syndrome. Adriane Schmackers is a Sophomore at St. Henry. She was diagnosed with MPS IIIA at the age of 2.



Sanfilippo Syndrome is a rare inherited disorder that affects how the body breaks down certain natural substances called glycosaminoglycans. In children with MPS IIIA, the body is missing an enzyme needed to break down these substances, causing them to build up in the brain and body. Over time, this buildup leads to progressive damage, especially affecting the nervous system. Easiest way to picture the damage happening to the MPS body is to imagine if the garbage truck forgot to pick up all the trashbags along the streets. Eventually the streets would become impassable. This is what is happening inside Adriane's brain and body. With time she has lost the ability to speak, use sign language, sing, dance, walk, eat, stand, and even sit up straight. Some people refer to MPS as childhood dementia. Adriane will celebrate her 16th birthday on May 18. A milestone we never thought possible. Average lifespan is early teenage years.

Adriane currently sees 9 specialists at Cincinnati Children's. Mercer county has had 4 kids affected with MPS: Ava, Adriane, Carter and Heidi.

While there is currently no cure or treatment for MPS IIIA, researchers are actively working toward treatments and therapies. We are currently waiting on the FDA to approve the first ever treatment for MPS.

We have started the Adriane Schmackers Foundation, a non-profit 501(c)(3). Thru this foundation we will grant a yearly scholarship beginning with Adriane's graduating class in 2028 to students continuing their education in the Special Education or the Medical Field! 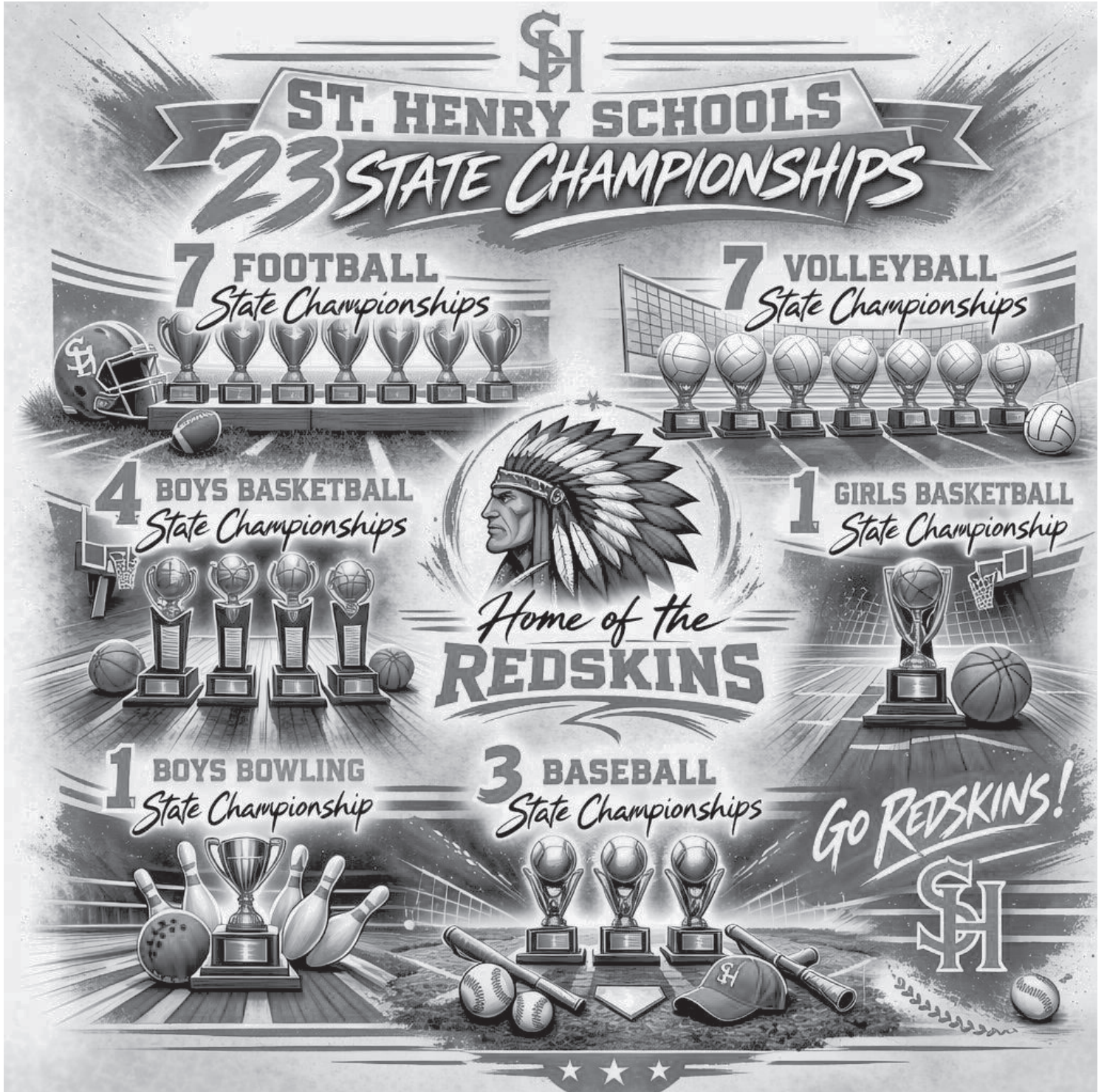

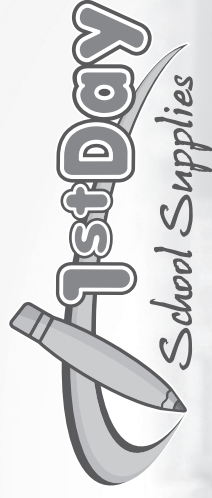
